Vice-Chancellor's International Excellence Scholarship for India - 2025



The Vice-Chancellor's International Excellence Scholarship for India (prior to 2023 named the University of Waikato International Excellence Scholarship) was established in 2015 to promote educational opportunities, foster internationalisation and support talented international applicants who are enrolling as new students into undergraduate or postgraduate programmes¹ at the University of Waikato. The Scholarships are tuition fees credits paid in NZD, have a value of up to \$15,000 for undergraduate study and up to \$10,000 for postgraduate study. Scholarships are awarded to applicants who have demonstrated excellent academic achievement. Successful applicants may be called upon to become global ambassadors for the University of Waikato.

1. Eligibility and Selection Criteria

- 1.1. To be eligible, applicants must:
 - 1.1.1. be a citizen or permanent resident of India.
 - 1.1.2. be applying to enrol full-time in an undergraduate or postgraduate programme¹, as a new international student to the University of Waikato.
 - 1.1.3. have received a conditional or unconditional offer of place from the University of Waikato.
 - 1.1.4. have a minimum GPA equivalency of B+ in the qualification used to gain entrance to the University of Waikato.
- 1.2. Applicants will be deemed ineligible if any of the following apply:
 - 1.2.1. Currently enrolled in the University of Waikato College or any University of Waikato degree programmes.
 - 1.2.2. Intending to enrol in:
 - a) a programme of study with a limited number of places (e.g. Master of Nursing Practice, Master of Pharmacy Practice.
 - a postgraduate teaching programme (e.g. Master of Teaching and Learning).
 - 1.2.3. Have paid tuition fees or applied for a visa at the time of application.
 - 1.2.4. Coming to the University of Waikato via a sponsoring body², a Guaranteed Credit Arrangement³, or through a study abroad or student exchange agreement.
 - 1.2.5. Are offshore applicants applying on or after:

³ Guaranteed credit arrangements are where an institution has a formal agreement with the UoW whereby a student can study part of their degree at the partner institution and credit that study towards study at the University of Waikato.

- a) 30 November for A Trimester offers of place.
- b) 30 April for B Trimester offers of place.
- c) 31 August for C Trimester offers of place.
- d) 31 October for H or X Trimester offers of place.

1.3. Selection is based on:

- 1.3.1. Academic merit.
- 1.3.2. Potential to become global ambassadors for the University of Waikato.

1.4. On-going eligibility is conditional on recipients:

- 1.4.1. Enrolling within 12 months of the dates outlined in the Offer of Place **and** commencing a full-time programme/s of study of at least 120 points at the University of Waikato in the year(s) of tenure.
 - a) The original scholarship offer is valid only within 12 months of the dates outlined in the Offer of Place unless deferral is approved.
 - b) If for any reason a recipient defers study at the University of Waikato within one calendar year from their original start date, their scholarship may also be deferred if the recipient advises scholarships@waikato.ac.nz when confirmation of the new start date has been received. If a student defers to a new date outside of one year, then their scholarship will no longer be valid, and they will need to apply again when scholarship applications are open for that new year.
- 1.4.2. Residing in New Zealand for the entire tenure of the scholarship and remaining studying full-time on campus in New Zealand.
- 1.4.3. Maintaining international student status within the University's student system during the entire tenure of the scholarship. Any change in status will result in the scholarship being fully or partly removed from the student's account. E.g., should a recipient withdraw from study after one trimester of study, the prorated scholarship value will be removed.

2. Awarding, Value and Tenure

- 2.1. The scholarship value is **between \$2,500 and \$15,000** (value dependent on clause 2.2) and is paid in full in the first trimester of study at the University of Waikato. The total value offered is a contribution towards tuition fees only, and all remaining tuition fees and other costs must be met through other means.
- 2.2. The number of scholarships offered, disbursement of award, and value of each scholarship offered is at the discretion of the Selection Panel and Scholarships Committee and is based on criteria such as, but not limited to, GPA equivalency, funding available, intended programme of study, and duration of intended programme of study. Recipients studying undergraduate programmes of study may receive up to \$15,000, and those studying postgraduate courses

- may receive up to \$10,000.
- 2.3. The scholarship will be applied directly to the recipient's tuition fees for the agreed programme of study either at the time of enrolment or once their enrolment is completed.
- 2.4. All applicants will be advised of the result of their application through their MyWaikato portal.
- 2.5. Successful applicants will receive a scholarship offer which is valid for 14 days. Offers must be accepted by the date indicated or the offer will lapse and no longer be valid.
- 2.6. After accepting the Scholarship Offer, recipients will receive an official scholarship offer letter to assist in any student visa application.
- 2.7. Recipients may pay the full tuition fee amount **minus** the value of the scholarship in the offer.
 They must provide their Scholarship Offer Letter to Immigration New Zealand in order to do so.
- 2.8. In accepting the Scholarship, the recipient will:
 - 2.8.1. be deemed to have read, understood and accepted the conditions of the Scholarship, and the <u>Scholarships Policy</u>.
 - 2.8.2. agrees to participate in any reasonable publicity concerning the Scholarship arranged by the University of Waikato.
- 2.9. The Scholarship tenure is 12 months.

3. Application

- 3.1. Applications can be submitted at any time and decisions will normally be made within 8 to 12 weeks of the time of application. However, applications will not be considered if received within four weeks of the start of each of the university's three main trimesters (A, B, and C Trimesters) or H Trimester of a limited number of qualifications
- 3.2. As part of their online submission, applicants must:
 - 3.2.1. upload their conditional or unconditional offer of place from the University of Waikato.
 - 3.2.2. ensure they provide specific details when explaining why they want to study at the University of Waikato and how they will be a global ambassador for the University of Waikato.

4. Selection Panel

- 4.1. Applications will be ranked and recommended according to the Selection Criteria by the International and Engagement Office and forwarded to the Selection Panel for consideration.
- 4.2. The Selection Panel will comprise the Chair of the Scholarships Committee and the Assistant Vice-Chancellor, International, Engagement and Partnerships (or their nominees).
- 4.3. The Selection Panel's decisions are final, and no correspondence will be entered into following each selection meeting.

5. Other Conditions

- 5.1. The Scholarship may **not** be held in conjunction with:
 - 5.1.1. any other University of Waikato funded tuition fees scholarship, award, bursary or other such funding, or
 - 5.1.2. any Education New Zealand scholarships or Manaaki Scholarship.
- 5.2. If, during the tenure of the Scholarship, a recipient's circumstances change in such a manner that their continued eligibility for the Scholarship may be affected, they must inform scholarships@waikato.ac.nz immediately.
- 5.3. The Scholarships Committee may terminate a Scholarship at any time, and recoup any funds disbursed, if the holder is not following the approved programme of study, withdraws from the University during the tenure of the Scholarship, brings the Scholarship or University into disrepute⁴, or is not otherwise complying with the regulations governing the Scholarship and/or the University of Waikato. The recipient will have the right to appeal against any decision to terminate the Scholarship.
- 5.4. Any ambassadorial duties will be at the discretion of the International and Engagement Office. Any queries about these duties can be made to gowaikato@waikato.ac.nz.
- 5.5. The Scholarships Committee has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided there is no departure from the main purpose of the Scholarship.
